LESSON OBJECTIVE:

To convey the importance of every membership taking <u>ownership</u> of their role in the Great Commission.

Matthew 28:19-20

We are all called to be a part of the Great Commission.

John 10:10

The enemy is robbing Christians of their call to share their faith and lead others to Christ.

1 Peter 2:9

Christians are:

- A chosen race
- A royal priesthood
- A holy nation
- A people for <u>His</u> own possession

Three things to help us take extreme ownership:

- 1. See <u>yourself</u> Biblically 2 Corinthians 5:20
- 2. Kill the <u>A.N.T.S</u> (Automatic Negative Thoughts) Romans 12:1-2
 - Categories of ANTS
 - Ant of "You Can't"
 - Ant of <u>Comparison</u>
 - Ant of Fear
- 3. You must invite accountability



Intentionally Practical

LESSON OBJECTIVE:

To embrace the importance of <u>following</u> Jesus intentionally by <u>sharing</u> our faith and to learn practical ways we can begin to do this.

Matthew 4:19

Jesus said, "Follow me and I will make you fishers of men."

To intentionally follow Jesus means that we will fishing for the souls of men.

Use the 4 W's to become intentional in sharing your faith.

1. WHO

Have you identified your "who?

- Name someone related to you who is not a Christian.
- Name someone that lives near you who is not a Christian.
- Name someone that you work with or go to school with who is not a Christian.
- Name someone you have encountered in your weekly schedule <u>who</u> is not a Christian.
- Name someone you are connected with on <u>social</u> media <u>who</u> is not a Christian.

Bottom Line: Find out where unbelievers are and start getting around them.

2. WHAT

What am I going to do to <u>reach</u> this person?

- Pray for them.
- Have <u>lunch</u> or coffee with the person.
- Volunteer to <u>help</u> the person coach.
- Volunteer to join the person in a project or job.
- Invite the family over for a meal.

The goal in answering the "what" question is to establish an environment in which you can get to know the person and have a gospel conversation with them.



3. WHEN

The "when" question is all about scheduling a specific date and time.

If you don't put a time stamp on "when" you want your "what" to happen with your "who," then it just remains a good idea floating around in your head. Put it on your calendar. Set it as an appointment.

4. WHERE

This question is all about <u>location</u>. Where will your "what" take place with your "who"? The goal is to be specific as possible. The more <u>specific</u> you are, the more apt you are to follow through.

LESSON OBJECTIVE:

To share the truth of the gospel using three objects and four words.

Object lessons are great, and they seem to <u>capture</u> the attention of those we are talking to much more than just words. This presentation is simple; you might say it makes sharing the gospel "<u>No Sweat</u>."

There are four key words in the presentation.

- 1. You are not an accident. Colossians 1:16
- 2. We are all apart from God. Romans 3:23; Romans 6:23
- 3. God <u>approached</u> us through Jesus. John 14:6
- 4. You must accept Jesus by faith. Ephesians 2:8



The Big Ask

LESSON OBJECTIVE:

To share the urgency of making <u>The Big Ask</u> when you share the gospel with someone and train us in helping others to cross the line of faith.

Today we want to learn about the importance and urgency of <u>The Big Ask</u>.

The greatest question a Christian can ask a person who doesn't follow Jesus is this: "Would you like for me to lead <u>you</u> in a <u>prayer</u> to give your life to Jesus?"

Why do you think this statement is true?

Scripture:

- Romans 10:9
- Romans 10:13

Application:

As you use the <u>three</u> visuals from last weeks lesson to <u>share Jesus</u>, you will be amazed at the response. Remember to ask the question, "What would keep you from <u>turning</u> from <u>sin</u> and <u>trusting Jesus</u> right now?" When the person responds with "Nothing", don't forget about The Big <u>Ask</u>.

The gospel conversation isn't complete until you <u>ask</u>, "Would you like me to lead you in a <u>prayer</u> to give your life to <u>Jesus</u>?

Leading a person to Christ may seem challenging, but it can be as simple as A.B.C.

- Admit you are a sinner. Romans 3:23
- Believe that Jesus' death and resurrection paid for your sin. John 3:16
- Confess Jesus as Lord of your life. Romans 10:13



Follow up:

- Make a big deal about their decision.
- Invite them to attend your church if they live in the community.
- When appropriate, write down their <u>name</u> and <u>email</u> and/or <u>phone</u> so you can send them more information.
- Ask them if they would like to talk with your <u>pastor</u>.
- Express to them the importance of <u>baptism</u>.
